PILOTING NEW TECHNOLOGY Eversound

"Hearing loss is the result of a life well lived. Far from a rarity, one-third of adults 61-70 years of age and 80% of those 85 and over will suffer hearing loss in their lifetimes" according to Dr. Gretchen Dixon.

Garden Park's Life Enrichment Team was selected to pilot the Eversound program in January 2023. The premise is simple: residents who would benefit from sound amplification in group and one-on-one settings are given headphones which connect wirelessly to the speaker's transmitters. The set of ergonomically designed headphones made of anti-microbial plastic are fully wireless and charge in the storage case. The transmitter can directly broadcast to as all residents who are wearing headphones. Headphones have been utilized in Bible Study, Book Club, Resident Council, parties and therapy. The transmitter and headphones can be up to an impressive 300 feet apart.

When Eversound reached out to Jennifer Peters to gauge interest in the program, she immediately shared the information with Lindsay Prohaska and Corey Porter as it aligns with the mission of Improving Quality of Life. Garden Park signed up for the pilot, but had to wait to learn if Louisiana would meet the threshold for participating facilities. Several zoom training courses and an on-site training with Eversound were necessary. Corey Porter was tasked with recording statistics related to the pilot program. Both she



and Lindsay received the Champion! Award by Eversound for their diligent work and passion for the program.

It is difficult to overstate the importance of hearing. Truly, it's impossible to understand the impact of our auditory functions. The effect of improved hearing can radically change one's quality of life. The first resident to try Eversound at Garden Park, Ms. Colleen Nichols, could finally hear in group activities but was also able to hear friends' voices for the first time. When the headphones were slipped on her, her eyes got wide and welled up with tears. She was amazed



to be able to hear as well as see the person speaking to her. Being able to hear someone and see them face to face brings a social intimacy which is lost when hearing is impaired. It is a respect issue: people who struggle to understand what others are communicating can feel isolated and those trying to communicate with someone with hearing difficulties finds their message falling flat. Corey Porter said, *"Eversound has helped our residents communicate better with one another and further cements the community connections in long-term care"*

Lindsay Prohaska added, "Eversound has proven to be more beneficial than we could have imagined, we did not realize what an asset it would be to our therapy department." The connection between hearing loss and successful outcomes in rehabilitation are often overlooked. Eversound provides clear, amplified sound directly to the patient which helps patient better understand and participate in therapy while also reducing the cognitive load by lessening the effort required to process sounds. Rehab Coordinator and Speech Therapist, Kelly Kirby-King said, "When the patients are able to better

hear us, they can better understand why we are working on certain treatment tasks, and how best to participate. This leads to increased engagement in therapy and more successful outcomes."





